Visit Concert 1 - 16:00

Chrey Taso Primary School Total number of students attending the concert: c. 150

The concert was held in the schoolyard. The artists performed under an awning.

22 December, 2007 Kompong Cham Visit Concert 2 - 8:00

Boeng Kak Secondary School Total number of students attending the concert: c. 150

At 7:00 a.m., when the participating artists arrived at the school gate, a great number of children lined up to welcome them.

The artists played among the children so that all the children had a clear view of the performers.



Visit Concert 3 – 10:00

Teacher Training College (TTC) in Kompong Cham Province

Total number of students attending the concert: c. 200

At the end of each performance, the students put handmade leis around the artists' necks.



Visit Concert 4 – 13:30

Kruosar Thmey School for the disabled Total number of students attending the concert: c. 150

In this school, students aged 6 to 14 with visual or hearing disabilities learn English and study traditional instruments in addition to the regular curriculum.

At the concert, enough time was provided for the students with visual disabilities to feel the sounds by touching the instruments.

Cambodia Dump Children Committee Total number of students attending the concert: c. 150

We also invited children from the Center for Children to Happiness supported by Japan Team of Young Human Power (JHP). The artists toured the facilities after the concert and interacted directly with the children.

Kien Klaing Center Total number of students attending the concert: c. 50

This establishment is dedicated to the rehabilitation of people maimed by land mines or children born with deformities. We allowed time for audience members to touch the instruments directly.
